Beware of Tainted Pet Foods & Treats!

We recently were notified by one of our clients about the loss of Bruno, their 4-year old male Chow. He had eaten tainted dog treats that destroyed his immune system. Their veterinarian was unable to reverse the damage in time to save Bruno.

In 2007, there was a lot of publicity concerning a recall of pet foods that contained ingredients from China ... specifically chicken jerky.

After doing some research, we found that this continues to be an ongoing problem. Identifying products that include ingredients from China is very difficult. You should stay away from anything that contains chicken Jerky because it could have come from China.

We did some research to see if the bar code might identify where the food is manufactured and packaged. It doesn't. Recently, we read that you could tell by the first three numbers, but according to Snopes, this is not true.

"packaged in America" it may

The United States has a hard

enough time monitoring food manufactured in our own country. There is no way they can oversee China or any other country.

Dog food is not the only problem. There have been reports of cat food and horse feeds also being tainted. This is an ongoing problem and all pet owners need to be aware and vigilant in reading labels. This is important in protecting our pets.

The two main health concerns are kidney and/or liver failure and immune system failure. Bruno started out by having crusty sores on his nose and ears. This progressed until his body was covered with sores. His vet said his immune system was depleted and his liver had failed. He had been fed *Waggin Train & Ever Pet* treats.

The USDA is investigating this, but it began in 2007 and we are no closer to an answer today nor any regulation enacted to prevent this from happening. Each of us can write our congressman and/or the USDA to complain and demand action on this issue before more pets are lost. In 2011 there were over 900 cases reported of pets suspected of being affected by tainted treats. The stores are still selling the products reported to have used ingredients from China that may have been



tainted.

Most of our pets only eat what we give them. They no longer forage for themselves. So, we are responsible for their safety.
