### THE FURMINATOR DESHEDDING TOOL

Many have asked us about using the Furminator deshedding tool to groom their Chows. Our response is a resounding NO!

The tool has a blade that actually cuts the hair. Not sure why they call it a deshedding tool, since it removes less loose

hair than it does actually cutting the hair. We prefer to use a slicker brush and a dematting comb. The comb can get down into the undercoat and remove any loose hair. The dematting comb also has a sharp edge on one side of the teeth. But, we don't find it cuts the hair, unless you come

upon a mat. You can force the comb through the mat and it will cut the hair.

However, regular grooming prevents the need for such drastic measures. We consider the Furminator to be a bit excessive on beautiful Chow coats.

#### **ROXY IN MICHIGAN**


From one of our clients emails:

#### HOW FAST DO THE PUPPIES GROW?

In a future newsletter, we plan to show sequential pictures of puppies from the day they are born until they reach six weeks of age to show how fast they grow. For now, I want to explain why nutrition is so very important, especially at this early stage.

When Chow puppies are born they typically weigh around 4-5 ounces. By the time they are six weeks of age they weigh

around 8-10 lbs. This fast growth spurt requires exceptional nutrition to keep up. We start by feeding our mothers dry puppy chow and wet puppy canned food. This is higher in calcium and protein to help her produce good quality milk for her puppies. We also add eggs and vegetable oil to her wet food. This gives her the added fat to her diet to help her keep up with all those growing puppies. At around three weeks, the puppies begin

trying to eat the kibble and we also give them canned wet food. They continue to get mom's milk until they are at least five weeks of age.

Their growth begins to level off around 12 weeks of age. They still are growing and nutrition is critical, but it isn't quite as fast as the first 12 weeks.

As puppies, these precious first few months pass by much too quickly!
