# Choking Can Be Deadly

We were recently notified of a sad and deadly choking incident involving one of our puppies..

The new owners had only had the puppy for a week. It had been playing and was eating when it suddenly began choking. The owner tried to dislodge the obstruction and finally was able to dislodge two small pieces of kibble dry food by using a Heimlich-type maneuver. Unfortunately, it was too late for the puppy. She could not

be revived.

The new owner had mixed dry kibble with the canned wet dog food. The puppy had just came in from playing outside and was excited. She began to eat and apparently aspired the food into her airway. It appears, that due to eating too quickly and the fact that there were hard pieces of kibble, she choked.

At the kennel we never mix dry kibble with wet food. We have mixed kibble that has been left to sit for a few min-

utes in warm water or milk with puppy formula, added to wet food for young puppies. Puppies are much like human babies who must graduate to different food types as they grow. They begin eating dry kibble at about five weeks of age. But, they eat one piece at a time and initially often drop pieces from their mouth. As they grow they become better with their eating. It isn't until they are about 12 weeks of age that they really do well with hard foods.

### **Another First**

# Vaccinations ... Pros vs. Cons

Please check out the American Veterinary Medical Association website for information on vaccinations.

They do not recommend yearly booster shots for most dogs. It has been found that the yearly booster shots can cause long term auto-immune problems.

There is also great controversy as research has surfaced problems with rabies vaccinations having long term ad-

verse affects on dogs. Please wait until your puppy is at least one year old to get it's first rabies vaccination.

These vaccinations are extremely potent and are hard on young immune systems.

Discuss the pros and cons of any vaccinations or the use of medications to prevent fleas and ticks. We need to be careful of what we put on or in our pets just as we are for ourselves and our children. Everything has it's affect and often times there are side affects that, if known, you would not be willing to assume the risks. Remember ... any chemical products introduced into the body is going to have an affect. The question should always be ... do the pros outweigh the cons? Your decision may have a significant impact on your pet.
