New Pet GPS Technology

Now it is possible for you to locate your pet by using a Global Positioning System, GPS. Although I have been unsuccessful finding a microchip version yet, you can purchase a tracking system that is affixed to a collar. The prices start around \$150.00 and go up from there. You will additionally have to pay a monthly maintenance fee of approximately \$13.00.

Your pets personal information, as well as your contact information, is recorded in a national registry. If you make an inquiry concerning a lost pet, the managing company will track your pet and inform you of the

pet's location.

Some collars even have a built-in phone that can allow you to speak directly to your pet, or for someone who may find your pet to notify you.



According to the Humane Society, less than 17% of lost pets are recovered. If your pet has a hankering to roam, you might want to research this option.

Acquiring Pet Insurance

With the rising cost of veterinary care for pets, private insurance is something that many are looking into.

After going online and reviewing the plans of three different companies, I can assure you there are a wide variety of options. Similar to human medical insurance, there are varying levels of coverage that translates directly into the amount of your premium payment.

I checked out **ASPCA**, **Petplan**, and **VPI**. All three have basic to premium plans, covering accidents only, to yearly checkups. All have a cap on yearly coverage depending on the level of the plan.

The following sample are the estimates for monthly premiums:

ASPCA - \$20 - \$100

Five plans available

Petplan - \$19 - \$23

Three plans available

VPI - \$34 - \$44

Three plans available

As you can see from the number of plans and their varying costs, there are options to choose from. It will require research on your part to determine which plan might best fit your pet's needs. Most plans will not go into affect until your pet is a

minimum of 8 weeks old. They often give discounts for more than one pet. Some pre-existing conditions are covered in the higher level plans. Be sure to read what is not covered as well as what is. You might be amazed at what most would consider to be very important, but may be on the "not covered" list.

When an accident happens or a serious illness occurs, insurance may determine whether an animal lives or must be euthanized. Many pet owners cannot absorb exorbitant medical bills. Insurance can provide a peace of mind, knowing that your pet will receive the necessary medical care.
