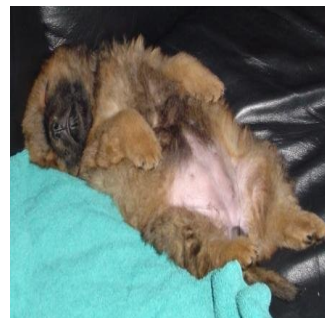


Our little ambassadors are going all over the country and we are really proud of each of them!

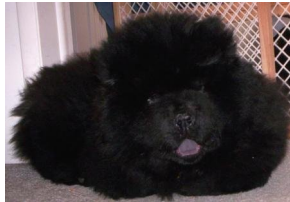
Buddy has settled into his new home and is loved by all. He is a very energetic little guy with aspiration of becoming a chef. This was after he real-

### Microchipping

D & M Farm now offers microchipping for your new puppy. The microchip is safely inserted under the skin and can be read by an electronic scanner. Each microchip number becomes part of a national registry. If your puppy were ever lost or stolen, this method of identification could be crucial in finding and identifying your dog.
